Environment charities unveil print website

Print buyers are to be targeted by a new website launched by charities Greenpeace and Friends of the Earth (FoE), which will help them to source more environmentally friendly print.

Paper Print Environment lists environmentally accredited print companies and paper grades that are FSC-certified, and is aimed at helping print buyers, designers and specifiers reduce their environmental impact.

Greenpeace and FoE print buyer David Shorto said: "The website dispels myths and gives information about environmental issues. I try to persuade companies at every opportunity to use accredited printers."

The online service is supported by FoE, Greenpeace,

the BPIF, WWF and the Soil Association.

Paper listings on the website include information such as the country of origin of a particular grade, the firm that produces it and a fibre breakdown. It also contains contact details for the companies that produce the material.

Print companies listed on the site are all environmen-

tally accredited. Shorto said: "It is not a list of companies that claim to be environmentally sound. Only companies that are accredited will be included."

Firms featured on the website pay a fee to be included, but Shorto explained: "It is not just a passive listing, it is a promoting resource. All companies featured will gain value for money."

The site also offers explanations of environmental accreditations including ISO 14001, EMAS, Greenmark, FSC and the BPIF's environmental assessment scheme.

Shorto said he has also been approached by European members of his two organisations about producing a similar website for mainland Europe.

Fuji to raise ink prices by 6%

Fujifilm Sericol has become the latest supplier to announce price increases, with rises of up to 6% for its screen inks and screen-making products.

From 2 April, the company's UV screen inks and screen-making supplies will rise by 3% and all other inks, solvents, emulsions and screen-making chemicals, will rise by 6%. Digital inks are exempted from this round of price increases.

The firm has blamed rises in its own cost base for the move. In particular, it cited the rising cost of utilities, packaging and transport.

Fujifilm Sericol UK commercial director Nigel McNae said: "Despite a proactive programme to absorb this, we continue to experience tight supply and significant price increases on many key raw materials."
